PASTOR'S PEN

I voted this morning. As I did so, I wondered how Jesus would relate to our modern day political debates and party affiliations? I imagine the Lord would have things to affirm and things to critique on both the political left and the political right. And that helps me keep things in perspective. I hope it will help all of us, especially those who are tired of the rancor and negative caricatures that so often accompany political discussions in our day. Whichever candidates win, God is still in control of our world...and I trust God.

I read a neat article by Scott Sauls on Behaving Christianly in Our Politics, and he noted that one thing we can say for sure about government is that God is in favor of it. And that's true! Throughout the Bible we see that God is concerned with order. So Presidents, members of congresses, kings and gueens and parliaments, governors, mayors, and council members, even police officers, military personnel, park and school district employees and other public servants, are all a part of God's plan to bless human communities and keep things running in an orderly, safe, and respectful fashion. And when our human communities are healthy and run well, God is glorified!

As we note in the Bible, even Jesus paid taxes and encouraged his disciples to do the same. And to those living in Rome, whose government was not always friendly to Christians, the Apostle Paul wrote to submit to those in authority and be respectful, conducting yourself with honor (see Romans 13.1-7). The Bible highlights numerous God-fearing men and women who held office. Deborah served as a judge over Israel; Joseph served as prime minister under the Egyptian Pharaoh; Daniel served in the court of King Nebuchadnezzar in Babylon; and Nehemiah served as a trusted official and cupbearer to the Persian King Artaxerxes. Government has always been a part of God's plan...

But when it comes to politics, the Bible gives no indication that Jesus would side completely with one side or the other. Still, we wonder: is Jesus for us, or for our opponents? Consider the following encounter between Joshua and a servant of God (Joshua 5.13-15 [CEB]):

When Joshua was near Jericho, he looked up. He caught sight of a man standing in front of him with his sword drawn. Joshua went up and said to him, "Are you on our side or that of our enemies?" He said, "Neither! I'm the commander of the LORD's heavenly force. Now I have arrived!" Then Joshua fell flat on his face and worshipped. Joshua said to him, "What is my master saying to his servant?" The commander of the LORD's heavenly force said to Joshua, "Take your sandals off your feet because the place where you are standing is holy." So Joshua did this.

So we wonder, "Lord, are you for us, or for our adversaries?"

And the Lord answers, "Neither."

When it comes to godly leadership, Jesus sides with himself! Perhaps the question we should be asking is not "is Jesus on our side?," but "are we on Jesus' side?" In politics and all other human agendas, our first loyalty should be to Christ. Maybe our key to experiencing unity and peace - regardless of our politics - is to share this highest allegiance to Christ? Just a thought...

WHAT IS THE FIVE DOLLAR CLUB?

The Five Dollar Club is New Bethel UMC's basic benevolent fund, used to help those who come by the church seeking some kind of assistance. In fact, we



used it this past Sunday (11/4), as a man came to church as the second service was ending and was wondering if we could help him with gas and food. He is a new resident of Glen Carbon and is very low on funds since he had to pay rent. Pastor Penny welcomed him to our town, visited with him a few minutes, and had him fill out one of our assistance forms, as she explained our "Pay it Forward" program to him.

We are happy to help people in the name of Jesus Christ. If this is the only time they will need assistance from us, we just bless them in Jesus' name and tell them not to worry about paying us back. But if a person might need more assistance in the future, we ask that they pay forward an hour of time, for every \$25 used to help them. They can "pay it forward" by helping with one of our community projects (i.e. Trunk or Treat, Soup and Bread, or Habitat for Humanity) or they can pay it forward by worshipping with us at any service. For example, if we help someone with \$50 towards rent, then they have to pay forward two hours, before they are eligible for any more assistance from us. This method seems to work well in holding people gently accountable, while guarding their dignity.

As for our guest on Sunday, we gave him some bread and a few canned goods, told him about the Glen Ed Food Pantry, and then Linda and Larry Lawhead drove to the local gas station, while the man followed in his car, and Linda filled up his tank with \$47 in gas. Hopefully, he will return to worship with us at New Bethel UMC, sometime in the future.

Other ways we use the Five Dollar Club funds include utility assistance, care bags (with food and personal hygiene items), medicines, bus passes, emergency lodging, and other miscellaneous ways, as the needs arise.

If you know of someone in need, please speak with Pastor Penny or another staff member, anytime. This fund is here to help people - inside and outside the church family. As Paul wrote the Galatians 6.10, Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers (NIV).

We have "adopted" a family for Christmas; we will shop for them in December.


Planning has begun for Mission Trip 2019! Let Judy know if you are interested.
